Under the terms of the Cultural Agreement between Israel and The Netherlands, the two countries agreed to hold biennal symposia on the History of the Jews of The Netherlands. The first symposium of this kind was held in September 1980 in Amsterdam. It met with very favourable response, even beyond academic circles and attendance was much greater than had been anticipated.

The second symposium will take place in Israel, and will open in Tel Aviv on 28 November and close in Jerusalem on 2 December. The institutions responsible for organisation are: the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, the Tel Aviv University, the Institute for Research on Dutch Jewry, the Israel Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Israeli Ministry of Education and Culture. Its range will be wider and the subjects treated more varied than in the first symposium. More than forty lecturers, many of senior academic standing will take part in the symposium. Half of them are Israelis, the rest come mostly from The Netherlands; the U.S.A., France and England are also represented.

Lectures will be held on Jewish history, religion, culture, economy and sociology. Special attention will be paid to Jewish creativity: in Literature (Hebrew, Spanish, Yiddish and Dutch), in Plastic Arts and in Music. Jewish liturgical compositions by Sephardi and Ashkenazi composers in The Netherlands will be performed at a special concert. One of the main features of the symposium will be the relationship of the Dutch Jewish Community with other Jewish Communities, especially that of Eretz Israel.

Parallel with the symposium, the Beth Hatefutsoth will display an exhibition on Dutch Jewry in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, prepared by the Joods Historisch Museum of Amsterdam. Participants of the symposium will be invited to the opening ceremony, which will be followed by the opening of the symposium.

Following the symposium, a meeting is planned of demographists, sociologists and genealogists. Reports will be presented on research projects now in progress and plans for the future will be discussed.

We hope that you will join us in this event and are looking forward to welcoming you in Israel.
